Severe Rain in Nashville

Severe rains slammed into Nashville, Tennessee overnight, pushing creeks and rivers past their banks and leaving 4 people dead Sunday morning.

The storm that hit Tennessee brought the most rainfall for a single day during March in Nashville history. About 130 people needed to be rescued from cars, apartments, and houses, authorities said.

The police recovered a body of 70 year-old Garry Cole from a vehicle near Sevenmile Creek. The Metro police reported another flood death on the Nashboro Village golf course Sunday morning. They found Douglas Hammond, 65, who lived nearby. By mid-morning, two additional people had died, a 64 year-old man, Frederick Richards and a 46 year-old woman. Both were found near a homeless camp in a wooded area near Wentworth-Caldwell Park. The woman has not yet been identified by the police.

Meanwhile, rescue groups across the Nashville region have been busy all night, rescuing people from trapped cars and homes.

Office of the Emergency Management Chief William Swann said crews continued Sunday to go through all homeless encampments and creek beds to make sure everyone is accounted for.

The Southern Korean entertainment company HYBE, previously known as Big Hit Entertainment is linking up with Ithaca Holdings.


